The Foodbank made significant strides in our efforts to source and distribute more food for the people we serve.

In 2014, the Stark Community Foundation commissioned a report to examine the future of food security and hunger-relief services in Stark County. Following recommendations from the report, the Stark County Hunger Task Force, Community Harvest and the Akron-Canton Regional Foodbank formed a group that began meeting regularly to determine potential opportunities for a stronger partnership.

As a result of those conversations, in 2016, the stage was set for the Foodbank and Community Harvest to be merged on January 1, 2017. The merger is a significant investment in food rescue in Stark County and will

jump start related efforts in Summit and surrounding counties.

Community Harvest collects excess prepared and perishable food and donates it to community groups that serve families struggling with hunger. This simple concept that began with a goal of preventing food waste has evolved into a collaboration of numerous resources and agencies dedicated to helping those who are hungry.

Collaboration happens because organizations come together toward a common vision. In this case, hunger-relief was collaboration's fuel that allowed our organizations to reach new heights, as one.

GOAL 2

TO LEVERAGE
FOOD AS A

CATALYST



Produce provides a powerful catalyst for solving hunger.

In 2016, the Foodbank provided 8.4 million pounds of produce to the network. Fresh fruits and vegetables are essential to any balanced diet and greatly benefit the individuals we serve, like Stephanie's family.

Stephanie, a recent graduate of Kent State University, is currently searching for a job. Because of health issues, the search has been harder than expected. She can't stand for long periods of time, is hearing impaired and struggles



with frequent seizures.

With lingering bills and the cost of raising her six-year-old and nine-year-old daughters, her family of four could barely make ends meet—until she found a food pantry close to her home. She is not only thankful for the fresh breads, produce and other food they receive—but thankful for the

opportunity to provide her daughters with nutritious choices.

With the help from this food pantry, it takes a little of the pressure off of Stephanie's family. She is looking forward to the day she can come to the pantry solely as a volunteer—to help others that find themselves in her current situation.

GOAL 3

TO BE
CONNECTED
IN SERVICE

To further amplify the voices of those we serve, the Foodbank is doing pioneering work in the field of client empowerment through the power of listening.

In 2016, the Foodbank launched **Voices**, a pilot program for nationally-funded work aimed at collecting feedback from individuals in need of food assistance. The guiding principle of this work is to affirm those receiving food assistance as the experts of their own experience.

Beginning with eight hunger-relief programs, the Foodbank started to focus on learning from those served by partner programs and evaluating information gathered to make meaningful, systematic changes on how we serve the community. The hope of the **Voices** program is to give a “voice” to those who usually feel voiceless and to increase advocacy

efforts to maximize the impact to the hunger-relief system as a whole.

Julie, Food & Building Manager at OPEN M, shares, “When people come to our pantry, they feel like they can’t say anything to us in regards to our program because they are just so grateful for the food. The **Voices** program breaks down those barriers and upholds the dignity towards our guests while letting them know people are willing to listen—and just how much we value their voice. In the past few months, we’ve received feedback like offering more diabetic-friendly items for our seniors—an issue that never came up before we began asking what’s important for our community.”

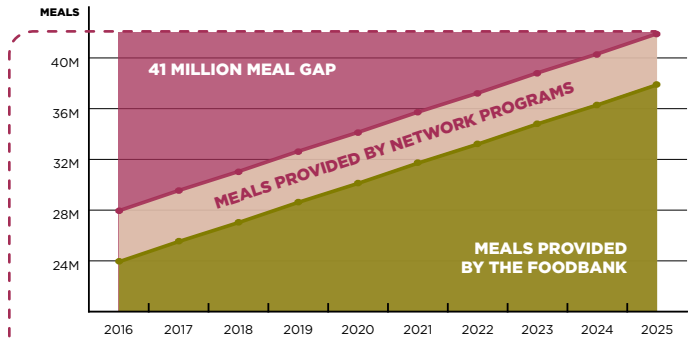

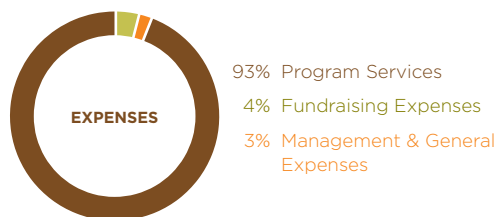
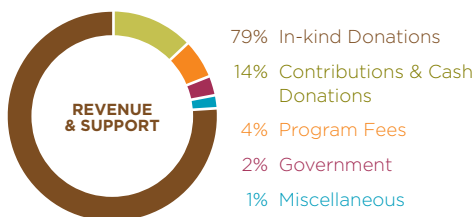
