## Your Foodbank continues to experience an unprecedented year.

We distributed more than 3 million pounds of food each month for the past

**ten months.** The Foodbank and our network of partners have seen a 21% increase in the number of visits from people seeking help with groceries compared to the first half of 2023. Pounds of food distributed are up 19% compared to last year. Thankfully, food donations from most of our food sources are up, too, but our inventory turnover rate is still extremely high, meaning we're distributing food faster than it's coming in.

As the demand for groceries remains high, support from our generous community is vital to our ability to feed our neighbors experiencing hardships.
