You are helping people like Sandra!

Although Sandra came to the hot meal site alone, sitting in a room with more than 100 people enjoying a meal, she doesn't feel alone. During dinner at Refuge of Hope, a child next to Sandra finishes his meal early, and asks her if she's going to finish her fruit. She smiles, pushes it toward him, and tells him to enjoy it. What the child doesn't know is that Sandra has diabetes, and the fresh fruit and healthy options available during the meal help sustain her health.

For 17 years, Sandra worked for a Fortune 500 company, but due to health reasons, she was let go. Because of the job loss and a fallout with her family, she's been homeless and forced to spend a few nights



sleeping on a park bench. But no matter the situation, she continues to talk about the blessings in her life.

Refuge of Hope receives food from the Akron-Canton Regional Foodbank and Community Harvest, and gives Sandra more than a meal when she needs it most; it gives her strength, and belief in herself. Sandra hopes to remain a light for those around her, and continues to be the best neighbor she can be—even if that means simply sharing her fruit.

Clean Room ready for volunteers

Your Akron-Canton Regional Foodbank recently opened a 670 square-foot state-of-the-art Clean Room that will allow the Foodbank to purchase bulk quantities of foods like pastas and cereals that can be repackaged in smaller serving sizes for families facing hunger.

The Clean Room is a separate enclosed room in the Foodbank's warehouse that is designed with the highest standards of food safety. Outside expertise from area corporations like The J.M. Smucker Co. and The Goodyear Tire & Rubber Co. helped with the strategy and implementation of the room that now features its own air filtration system and temperature controls for optimal food freshness.

Since opening in October, teams of volunteers, like those from Allstate Insurance, Westfield, Dunkin Donuts and Fedex, have repacked more than 40,000 pounds of bulk product that was made available to our network of hunger-relief partners!

What does this mean for you? Your dollars are going further than ever before! Repacking bulk product is less expensive than purchasing pre-packaged product.

Not only does the Clean Room allow us to bring in more products for our network, it also provides an additional hands-on opportunity for volunteers.
